# Bottle to table recycling loop 

## Cow

On average 1 cow produces 90 glasses of milk a day.


## Milk tanker

The farmer milks the cow and then the milk is transported by milk tanker to the bottling plant.


## Recycled tables

The recycled plastic planks are used to make sustainable outdoor furniture including picnic tables, benches, seating, fencing and planters. Guaranteed to last for up to 25 years!


Manufacture
The pellets of recycled plastic are then used to make planks of plastic lumber in a multitude of different colour options. The pellets will also be used to make new plastic milk bottles.

## Reprocessor

The recycled plastic milk bottles are transported to a reprocessor where they are washed and cut up into tiny pellets.

## Collection

A recycling lorry collects your recycling and takes it to a materials recycling facility where it is sorted into different recycling types.

## Recycling bin

Recycling your milk bottle is easy - once finished you just rinse it out and put it into your recycling container ready for collection.

Bottling plant
All the plastic bottles are filled with milk before being transported to shops and supermarkets for you to purchase.


Supermarket
You can buy lots of different milk in different sized containers.
The most popular is a 4 pint plastic bottle of semi-skimmed milk.

Most of us use milk everyday whether it is on our cereal or in cups of tea or coffee.
